Well, the 2018 Sporting Clays Shoot Fundraiser is behind us and the people that helped pull it off did another great job. We weren't blessed with the greatest weather – the high for the day was about 35 degrees, but compared to the Saturday before when it was raining and the Saturday after when we had a blizzard, we ended up with the best of the three Saturdays. With the cold weather, just about everything was moved inside the clubhouse at J&H, including raffle ticket sales and bucket raffles and although it was the proverbial ten pounds of stuff in a five-pound bag, everything went really well.

We had about 400 rounds of sporting clays shot that day, with about 350 first rounds and about 50 people shooting an additional round. Attendance was down a little bit from some of the past years, but the weather seemed to keep a few folks home.

WHEELCHAIR WHITETAILS RECAP - A Unique Opportunity for Persons with Disabilities - Keith A. Pamperin

Last year during the first week of November, I along with two friends from Challenge the Outdoors Inc. were invited to participate in the final bow hunt at Steve Nooyen's, Wheel Chair Whitetails in Florence County, WI....and what a fun experience it was. Tommy Namore and I left Green Bay Thursday morning November 9th full of anticipation. Jeff Pagels and his wife Jane were to meet us in camp later that evening. The further north we traveled the snow increased making traveling and the north country beauty more interesting. The Wheelchair Whitetails property is very secluded

with a long meandering entry road through stands of mature maple trees, bordered by thousands of acres of Marinette and Florence County public land.

Steve says, "Having been extraordinarily blessed by God, my wife Kristi and I have chosen to steward our God-given resources for the benefit of wheelchair-bound individuals through a program called Wheelchair Whitetails, LLC." In summary, Wheelchair Whitetails offers a three-day guided deer hunting experience to wheelchair bound hunters at no cost. The hunts are crossbow only and occur from mid-September to mid-November on the Nooyen's 520-acre private property located about 90 minutes north of Green Bay in Florence County, WI.

These are fair chase hunts with no fences. Hunts are conducted from wheelchair accommodating ground blinds, and transportation is provided to and from the blinds. All equipment, meals, and accommodations are provided for selected hunters and a companion at no cost.

In 2017, the inaugural year for Wheelchair Whitetails, Steve & Kristi hosted 17 hunters plus companions. Hunters arrived in camp Thursday morning, and after orientation, lunch, and some practice with the crossbows they were off to the woods. Hunters departed camp by noon on Saturday. Every hunter saw plenty of deer, and several were successful harvesting does at the end of the season. Shots were limited to 40 yards or less to minimize non-lethal hits, and "shootable" deer are determined from year to year to maintain a healthy deer population.

After getting settled in the very comfortable accessible lodge, followed by an orientation to the land via areal maps and a few practice shots with cross bows at varying distances, we were off for the evening hunt. Steve took us out to the blinds with a cool and brisk UTV ride. Tommy and I decided we would hold out for a nice buck until the final morning of the hunt. We were amazed at the number of deer we saw.

That evening Jeff and Jane Pagels joined us in camp. Jeff stated he would be thrilled to take the first good doe, saying "I don't eat antlers." Jeff did just that, taking a nice doe Friday morning. Jeff reports "A high point of the weekend was when Steve dragged in the deer I killed to where I could touch it and we bowed our heads and gave thanks for the bounty just delivered".

After seeing plenty of deer, Friday including a few smaller bucks, Tommy and I agreed Saturday morning was "fill a tag time". We woke to a steady snow, with Steve taking Tommy to his blind, and Jeff and I to my blind. Jeff was going to be my camera man. Sure enough after about an hour in the blind, a nice doe appeared on the trail in front of me. After waking up my camera man, I took the shot. The deer made a giant leap and disappeared. After texting Steve, he came to look for the deer. Steve tracked the deer through the thick brush and heavy snow, and determined it was not vitally wounded. He said Tommy had also shot a doe, so he picked up Tommy and took the three of us back to camp. He changed into lighter clothes to track the two deer.

After about four hours, a very wet and exhausted Steve returned with Tommy's doe and determined that I need to spend a little more time judging distances with a crossbow.

Tommy Namore stated "I had a great time at Wheelchair Whitetails. I was really impressed with the amount of deer we saw. Steve and Kristi put on a 5-star deer hunt. We could not have asked for better accommodations even with two wheelchairs and a mobility scooter, everything was accessible. You can really tell Steve put a lot of thought into the blinds, designing something that anyone can use no matter their individual challenges. I personally learned a lot on the hunt, and even though it was a bow hunt, it kind of felt more like a retreat".

We are truly blessed to have people like Steve and Kristi Nooyen, that choose to inspire persons with disabilities to dream more, do more, and learn more in our great outdoors. I agree we could not have asked for more! Applications for fall hunts open March 1 of each year. CTO PONTOON BOAT – Challenge the Outdoors is again keeping its pontoon boat on Shawano Lake at the park docks in Cecil (southeast corner of the lake). The boat is available to any CTO member to use from roughly May 1 through mid-September. All you need to do is call Gary Thyges (715-584-7700) to reserve the boat for a half or full day. You'll need to bring your own fishing equipment. If you've never used the pontoon boat, you'll also need to take a short orientation course from Gary.

SHADOWS ON THE WOLF – SOTW has constructed several Handicapped-Accessible fishing piers in Outagamie County and one in Shawano County. These include Mac's Landing (north of Hortonville), Barker Park (south of Shiocton), Koepke Park (north of Shiocton), Village of Shiocton Municipal Building, Bamboo Bend Park (west of Shiocton), Co. Hwy S Boat Landing (west of Stephenville), and Sturgeon Park (City of Shawano). You can check them out and get directions on SOTW's website (www.shadowsonthewolf.org) if you're interested.

SHAWANO LAKE FISHING – Saturday, June 2nd is CTO's annual fishing outing on Shawano Lake. The event is held at the park in Cecil and no fishing license is needed as this is the DNR's free fishing weekend. Boats and bait are provided, but you will need to bring your own fishing equipment (CTO does have some equipment available). CHALLENGE THE OUTDOORS AWARDS PROGRAM 2017-2018

The 11th Annual Awards will be given out at the 2018 CTO Annual Banquet on July 21st, 2018.. Time frame to submit an entry for an award is from July 1, 2017 thru June 30, 2018.

Procedures, Rules and Details:

All the categories (Except Volunteer of the Year Able-bodied) entrants must have been a CTO DISABLED member before submitting an entry. The definition of a disabled member should meet at least 1 of the following requirements:

1. Have a Class A, B, or C hunting permit from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.
2. Have a disabled fishing license from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.
3. Other individuals can become qualified on a case-by-case basis. Contact Awards

The CTO Board of Directors shall appoint a CTO member as "Awards Administrator". In this capacity, this person will oversee tiebreakers, choose award winners in the "Honor" categories and otherwise administer this program. A CTO disabled member can only win one of the hunting, fishing, or shooting categories in any one year. Enter as many categories as possible so you have a better chance at winning. Always include the date that the activity was completed; and whether you were on your own, or during a CTO sponsored group event.

A CTO disabled member can only win a Biggest Challenge Overcome Outside Award and a Deep Doo- doo Award twice, and Volunteer of the Year Award once for the life of this Awards Program. A CTO able-bodied member can only win a Volunteer of the Year Award once for the life of this Awards Program.

Winners in these Honor categories might have their stories and photos published on our website and other publicity tools as are feasible. The winners might be notified of their Honors a few days before the banquet so they can prepare a brief presentation to the banquet attendees. The reason for this is to strive to show the group what a "real" winner does to gain such high recognition and provide inspiration for others to reach for similar achievements.

Volunteers and others will be encouraged to remind or make entries for disabled members with or without the member's knowledge. For example, boat captains on the Shawano Lake fishery will be advised to measure fish that might be award eligible.

All of the award winners in the categories below will receive a gift card for a retail store and a certificate for display.

AWARD CATEGORIES

BIGGEST CHALLENGE OVERCOME OUTSIDE: One year, a CTO member overcame his quadriplegia to hunt turkeys on his

own. He set and reset his blind to get the best spot; he got in the blind and set up and after several exciting close calls was able to bag a turkey. Try and top that one to win. A person can nominate themselves or be nominated by someone else. Past Winners include Mark Baehr, Steve Lang (twice), & James Luedke. Award = \$75 gift card.

DEEP DOO-DOO AWARD: For the CTO member who takes the biggest challenge in the outdoors while getting in a difficult situation. One winner was a wheelchair user who dropped a goose in a muddy cornfield after his able bodied buddy could not find the goose, he crawled through the mud to find it himself. While the mud got washed off in a hot shower, the glow of the satisfaction of his achievement will last lots longer. So, get out there and expand your limits. A person can nominate themselves or be nominated by someone else. Past Winners include Steve Lang (twice), Roger Mateer, Keith A. Pamperin, & Lauri Dubord. Award = \$25 gift card.

VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR(ABLE-BODIED): For the CTO member who best embodies the spirit of giving to help others enjoy the outdoors. A person must be nominated by someone else. Past Winners include Bill Mayville, Larry Zander, Karen Baehr, Rod Barkhaus, Tony Gehr, Gary Thyges, Carl Gierke, Rita Adamovich, Jane Day, & Bill Baehr. Award = \$100 gift card.

VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR (DISABLED): For the CTO member who best embodies the spirit of giving to help others enjoy the outdoors. A person must be nominated by someone else. Past winners include Jean Chapman, Judy Paluch, Toby Malchow, Larry Laehn, Mark Baehr, Peter Lathrop, Cliff Pheifer, Steve Harvey, Bob Day, & Patrick Nieuwenhuis. Award = \$100 gift card.

LONGEST FISH, BY THE FOLLOWING SPECIES. During a CTO event or on your own: (length in inches) No photograph required, but it would be nice. Great Lake/Green Bay Trout or Salmon, Inland Trout, Walleye, Musky, Northern, Perch, Small and Large Mouth Bass, Bluegill, Crappie, Rock Bass, White Bass, Catfish, Whitefish, & Rough Fish(Bullhead, Carp, Dogfish, Sheepshead, etc.). There will be one winner for the longest rough fish of all of the rough fish species. Award = \$15 gift card for the longest fish in each species.

CHASING RAINBOWS LONGEST TROUT AT BOTH EVENTS: (length in inches) No photograph required. There will be one award for each of the Chasing Rainbows events. Award = \$15 gift card.

BIGGEST WHITETAIL BUCK HARVESTED DURING A CTO EVENT OR ON YOUR OWN: Number of Points longer than one inch x maximum inside spread in inches. No photograph required, but it would be nice. In case of ties or near ties, antlers will be re-examined in more detail by CTO Award Administrator. Award = \$25 gift card.

BIGGEST TOM TURKEY HARVESTED DURING A CTO EVENT OR ON YOUR OWN: Length in inches of spurs and beard. The weight of the turkey is also required. No photograph required, but it would be nice. Award = \$25 gift card.

TOP SCORE FOR DISABLED SHOOTER AT THE J&H SPORTING CLAYS FUND RAISER: Bust the most clay pigeons and win. Top score = 50. Award = \$25 gift card.

TOP OVERALL TRAP SHOOTER: Top 3 rounds times the distance for the year. Top score would be a score of 25 times the maximum yardage of 27 yards times 3 = 2,025. Award = \$25 gift card.

TOP OVERALL SKEET SHOOTER: Top three rounds for the year. Top score would be a score of 25 times 3 = 75. Award = \$25 gift card.
