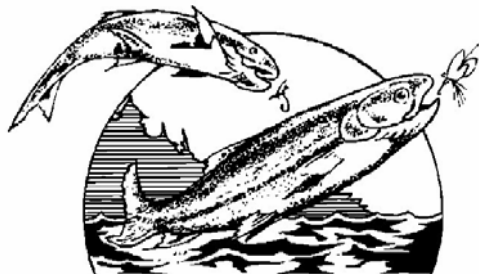
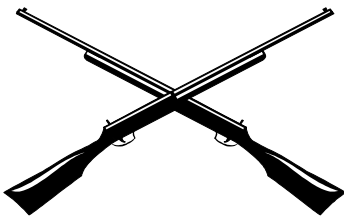

Over the past two years due to the hard work of most directors and many members Challenge the Outdoors has progressed in many ways. We have tripled our assets, having acquired the following equipment: 24' pontoon and trailer, 38' x 8' storage trailer, 10' x 10' tent, grant money to purchase an enclosed 12' x 8' storage trailer, donation of a 60 HP Mercury motor for the pontoon, and various smaller items to numerous to mention, as well as a financial reserve of over \$13,000. Our fundraisers have been extremely successful, realizing over \$20,000 in net profits,

Our outreach program has also increased tremendously. We have networked with: Little Wolf Gobblers of the Wild Turkey Federation, Trout Unlimited, United Federation of Disabled Archers, Ducks Unlimited, Whitetails Unlimited, Wisconsin Wildlife Federation, Wings over Wisconsin and the Wingettes, Fishing has No Boundaries, Twist of Fate, and Hunt of a Lifetime.

We have also reached out to the following disabled organizations and facilities: Physically Challenged Kids, Muscular Dystrophy Association (Green Bay), Westhill Rehab, Options for Independent Living, Multiple Sclerosis Association, Bureau for the Blind, as well as other organizations and individuals.

While this is largely due to the continued hard work of our Executive Board and Directors we would like to see more membership involvement in our fundraising efforts and at our special events that are provided. I strongly encourage ALL members to attend our 1st Annual Membership Banquet and Meeting on July 26, 2003 at the River Rail in Shiocton. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all individuals and organizations who have donated time and items for our various events. It is only through your active participation that this organization can progress and further realize its Mission Statement.

WE'VE DONE IT AGAIN!! Another great outdoor activity for CTO members, family and friends. As promised in your last newsletter, more information about this event would be coming and here it is:

Yes! The trout (rainbow) are here and have been putting on weight as they are hungry little beggars. They are fed anywhere from 6 to 10 times a day. The new food that we purchase for these fish produce as a delectable eating quality as any trout I've caught in the wild. You'll agree when you serve them to your family and friends.

There are plenty of tables and chairs under giant trees and the pond bank is level for those in wheelchairs, plus shelter in case of rain. The trout you catch will be cleaned, bagged and iced for you. (Bring your cooler to take them home.) There are a few huge trout in the pond and if you hook into one you'd better have your butt anchored to shore. I judge one of them to be about 9 lbs and a few at 6-7 lbs. For any of you who would like to eat some while they're still kicking I and/or yourself can do them on an open pit fireplace. I've got a recipe that'll make Emeril envious.

Each member of CTO will be allowed up to 10 trout on this day. If three people are fishing on one membership, the limit is still 10 (i.e. 4 for one and 3 each for the other two). If all goes as I expect these fish will weigh better than 1 lb each and some may reach two. For those without fishing equipment: No Problem! We'll have enough here, as well as the bait. No License Needed—Open Fishing Days. If any trout are left members are welcome to come out any day Wednesday through Sunday. We ask that your limit be 5 per trip with a total of 10 each month. You do not have to call ahead, just come when you like.

Challenge the Outdoors, Inc will furnish meat and beverages. It would be appreciated if each member bring a dish to pass or a dessert.

I will not be feeding these fish for two days prior. We want them to be hungry—don't we? Please release blue gills, crappie, perch and bass if you do not intend to eat them.

We're easy to find! Take Hwy 47 to the Outagamie/Shawano County line where you'll see a bridge. That's Shady Rd. Coming from the South—cross bridge and immediately turn left (West) on Shady Rd 1/2 mile and you're there. If coming from the North on 47 go to the county line and turn right (West) just before the bridge. CTO signs will be posted. Any questions call Larry Zander at 920-525-5637.

## 2003 Fishing & Boating Season is Here!! - By: Mark Baehr

So, we heard you want to go fishing on Shawano Lake. Well then, what are you waiting for? **LET'S GO!!**

This boating season marks the third in which CTO is doing its part to make sure the physically challenged people we serve, along with their families and friends, are provided opportunities to get out and enjoy fishing and or sightseeing outings on Shawano Lake.

For this boating season we have rented a slip in Cecil, on the east end of Shawano Lake. See the map for our June 7<sup>th</sup> Fisheree in our May Newsletter. The slip is located just south, approximately 100 yards, of the Village of Cecil's Lake Park. The dock leading to our pontoon boat, while wheelchair accessible, is quite long but the Village's public access has two short wheelchair accessible docks that make loading and unloading much easier. The park also has wheelchair accessible restrooms, a large parking lot, and a fish cleaning station.

The pontoon is being reserved on a first come first served basis so pick a date(s), soon, and give either Harland or Mark a call and they will do their best to see to it that you are taken care of. Our slip rental runs thru September, so there is plenty of time remaining to plan fishing and or sightseeing outings. We are happy to say we have a few experienced volunteer captains and first mates willing to take people out on these outings. They are available on some weekends and weekdays. First and foremost safety is our biggest concern. That is why we are requiring that ***all*** those wanting to captain our boat have prior boating skills and knowledge of how to properly operate our boat. An operational checklist, that will be laminated and kept on the boat, is being developed and should help prevent and keep problems to a minimum. If you all ready have an experienced boat captain willing to take you on an outing we will be happy to make arrangements for you. We can also arrange a training session for those who need instruction.

While a few volunteers have stepped forward to be captains and first mates we can always use more. ***This is where you can help!*** If you enjoy boating and or fishing this opportunity may be just what you've been looking for. By volunteering you will be providing a much-needed service, make new friends, create lasting memorable experiences, and probably land a few fish in the process. If this sounds like something you'd like to do please contact Harland or Mark. They'll be more than happy to fill you in on how you can get involved in this great opportunity.

If there are any obstacles that may prevent you from actively participating in an outing or event, i.e. a lack of adaptive fishing equipment or transportation, please contact our Special Events Disabilities Coordinator Bob Mayer at (920) 465-6143 or by email at: [Crossbowkids@aol.com](mailto:Crossbowkids@aol.com) Bob will act on behalf of individual members in overcoming any obstacles that would preclude a member's participation in events and bringing to the board's attention any action or funding deemed necessary by him to expedite a members involvement in activities.

We do have a good supply of terminal fishing tackle, (sinkers, bobbers, small jigs, and hooks), available for your use as well as 3 adult life vests. You will need to supply your own bait. Our pontoon boat fishes 5 – 6 people comfortably and has a maximum capacity of 12. So far this season several folks have taken our pontoon boat out on the lake for some fishing outings. Panfish continue to be the main target with bluegill, pumpkinseed, and rock bass making up the lions share of fish caught. Typically mornings and late afternoons are proving to be the best times for catching fish with leaf worms, night crawlers, and leeches being the preferred baits. While no one has been targeting them specifically, crappies, northern, and bass do provide great fishing action on Shawano Lake.

We look forward to hearing from you soon and hope you can and do take advantage of this great opportunity and remember.....***the best time to go fishing is.....Anytime you can..... Dennis expanded the deck space by moving the sides forward a few feet, widened both side gates to 40 inches, and installed two grab bars alongside the front gate. These improvements make our boat accessible and much, much more user friendly for everyone. And thanks to the donation of a like new Eagle fish locator by Mark Baehr we'll no longer be fishing blind. Look out fish you can swim but you can't hide!! Our thanks go to Dennis Diemel for the great work he did on our pontoon boat and to Bill Mayville and Mark Baehr for their dedication to and continued support of CTO. **Great job guys!** And as they say, we've saved the best news for last. Hang on to your seats for this one. Are you ready? The Wingettes, the SE Wisconsin Women's Chapter of Wings Over Wisconsin, have donated a brand new 60 HP Mercury Outboard to us! ***That's right a brand new 60 HP Mercury Outboard!!*** Truly a wish come true.

You may be asking yourself, how did that happen? Well, we're glad you asked. It all started in April of this year at the Wisconsin Wildlife Federation's Awards banquet in Mosinee, WI. While Larry Zander, along with Harland & Jean Chapman were visiting with members of the various other organizations they happened to meet and had a lengthy conversation with Arnie Mueller. Arnie was there to represent the Non-Profit Org. Wings Over Wisconsin. During their conversation about CTO Arnie said he would get in touch with us to see how they could help. The next week he contacted Harland & Jean and the topic of our pontoon boat came up and the fact that we were currently seeking a grant and private funding to purchase a new motor. Arnie told them he'd see what he could do and get back to us. A few days later Larry Zander received a phone call from Arnie saying that through the support of the Wingettes and Mercury Marine our motor was on its way.

On the afternoon of June 19<sup>th</sup>, representatives of the Wingettes; Jeanne Marchant, Pres, Mary Schultz, VP, Eunice Seering, Sec., Audrey Peardon, Treas., Bev Rohlinger, Director and Shirley Sarauer, Director along with Arnie Mueller of Wings Over Wisconsin, met Harland and Jean Chapman, Bill Shogren, Mark Baehr, Bill Mayville, and Chuck Nelson from CTO, at the Fond Du Lac Holliday Inn. In a simple ceremony the Wingettes presented CTO with the new 60 HP Mercury Outboard. The Wingettes purchased the motor with funds they raised at their April 2003 Banquet.

How do we go about saying thank you for such an incredible gift but to say ***Thank You So Much!*** And Thank You, Larry, Harland & Jean for taking the time to speak with Arnie Mueller and for being such good spokespersons for CTO. and getting this whole ball rolling.

This motor will provide CTO and the physically challenged sports persons we serve with many years of service. CTO is extremely fortunate and grateful that the Wingettes chose to support our organization, so, each and every time we start the motor to take another fishing trip or leisurely cruise we'll remember the day that the Wingettes, Arnie Mueller, and Mercury Marine became the wind beneath our wings by making our wish come true.

A quick history and background on WOW. In 1980, twelve concerned sportsmen organized Wings Over Wisconsin to reverse the decline of upland bird habitat in our state. To date there are now 20 chapters located throughout the state with over 4,000 members all totaled. WOW is A Nonprofit Organization Dedicated to Natural Resource Conservation & Education thru Youth & Community Involvement. Their list of accomplishments is quite impressive to say the least. Here are several of them, Named "Conservation Organization of the Year" by the Wisconsin Wildlife Federation in 1990 and 1996, cooperative funding for landowners implementing wildlife conservation practices, Leader in DNR's Wild Pheasant Restoration Program, Protecting nearly 1,000 acres of wildlife habitat through land acquisition, Hunter Education Sponsorships, Environmental education funding, and Scholarship funding for the conservation leaders of tomorrow.
