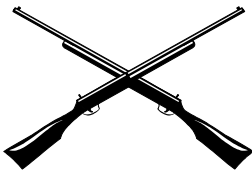


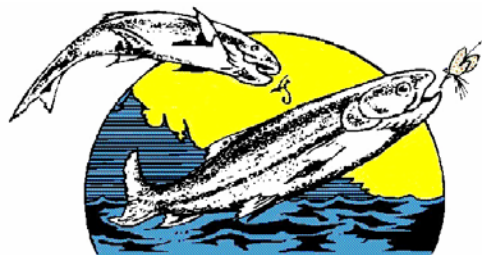

## **Cost Sharing Program for Adaptive Equipment Catching on!**

When we created our cost-sharing program, in Dec. of 2004, we weren't sure what kind of response we would get. A year and one-half later we're glad to report that we've had several members take advantage of the program purchasing crossbows, hand cranks, and an adaptive thumbhole gunstock. We are still waiting for our 1<sup>st</sup> adaptive fishing equipment request. For those unfamiliar with our cost sharing program here's how it works. **CTO will help our physically challenged members purchase adaptive hunting or fishing equipment by picking up to ½, but not to exceed \$100.00, for the cost of the piece(s) of equipment 1 time per year.** For example, say Jane purchases a crank for her crossbow and it cost \$150.00. CTO would reimburse Jane \$75.00. To receive reimbursement for a piece of adaptive equipment you are considering purchasing or to see if a piece of equipment you've purchased qualifies please contact Jean or Harland Chapman at: (920) 525-1123. **\*Note, keep your receipt and get a duplicate copy of the original because we will need a copy for our records. You may bring more than one gun, but depending on how busy it is, you may be asked to rotate to the rear of the line after each weapon is sighted in (to give others a chance to sight in also). Please bring any adaptive equipment you use for hunting along to display and share ideas with the other hunters. CTO will have an information tent on adaptive equipment set up. ## Spring Turkey Hunt 2007

Many close calls his year. I had a big gobbler come in just far enough to where I didn't want to chance a shot. Then I had something happen that is a very rare blessing. I had 2 bearded hens come in at the same time. They also were about 45 yards and seeing that I was using a black powder muzzle loading shotgun, I needed them closer. Friday morning I called to a turkey that responded instantly to the call, it was a hen (no beard). Then I called up a jake. He was gobbling and displaying for my decoy. Quite a sight. Then there was Saturday morning. I called in the same hen, she hung around for a while then wandered off. Then out of nowhere a jake came up and picked a fight with my decoy! He was beating up on that for 30 minutes before I finally got his attention by waving at him (dumb bird). LOL Then I was debating whether or not to move and fix the decoy. I didn't want to give away my presence but I decided to get up and get the decoy back up. He did tear it up pretty good though. He is on my list for next year! LOL

Then I sat for hours and hours, it seemed. The time I had considered going in came and went but I just stayed there a little while longer. The 2 hens had showed up about 9:30 am the day before so I figured I would wait till 10 am. Then I stayed for a bit, I called once more and waited, no response. I got turned around and was putting my stuff in my pack to go and took one more glance toward the path home and I was the sun glinting off the backs of 2 turkeys coming at me. I thought to myself that these must be the 2 bearded hens and decided to take one if that was them. It wasn't them, it was 2 big toms coming at a fast walk! I let out a couple quick yelps on my box call and they turned and were now coming straight in. I waited till they got very close to the decoy and I cocked one of the hammers. All Done! **26# field dressed, 1 1/8"+ spurs, 11" (about) beard.** This year's hunt was the best I've ever had. Even if I wouldn't have gotten the bird I would say this hunt was a 100% complete success!!
