New Challenge The Outdoors Shooting Programs

Great news! As I mentioned in this month's Presidents message CTO has received a generous donation of \$3000.00 from the Wingettes chapter of Wings Over Wisconsin to be used towards establishing CTO shooting programs. In the past the Wingettes have supported us through donations of a motor for the pontoon boat and portable Ice Shelters. I find it hard to put into words how much the Wingettes support of CTO has meant to both the organization as a whole and to those members whose lives have been affected by the Wingettes. On behalf of both myself and the membership of CTO, I humbly say **THANK YOU WINGETTES.**

The new shooting programs will start upon publication of this newsletter. CTO will be setting up a list of anyone that wishes to participate in shooting. We are working on getting some type of trailer to transport shooters around the Sporting Clay courses. **We also ask that every shooter call ahead at least a couple days in advance so we can make sure we have enough volunteer staff on hand to help shooters with special needs.** Below you will find the exact wording of the motions approved by the Board of directors. **If you have any questions feel free to call Toby Malchow at: 920 434-1663 email CTOforME@yahoo.com or: bruther-one@yahoo.com**

Program 1. (Sporting Clays)

“That CTO establish a monthly Sporting Clay Shoot for all CTO members. CTO would pay for the cost of shells and one round of shooting for each Physically Challenged participant. Those eligible for funding would be Physically Challenged members, elderly members at least 65 years old, and youth under the age of 18 when accompanied by an adult family member taking part in the shoot. Non-Physically Challenged or anyone not at least 65 years of age would not be eligible for funds. Adult family members shooting with youth would not be eligible for funding unless they qualify as Physically Challenged themselves. If approved the first event would be held on the second Tuesday of July 2008 at 1:00 p.m. and continue every second Tuesday of the month unless re-scheduled and posted in the newsletter. Shooters shall be responsible for the cost of their own food and beverages.”

Footnote: We will be shooting Sporting Clays at J&H. most of us come early (around 11:00 am) and enjoy a casual lunch at our own expense from the great J&H menu. We start gathering our equipment and loading up around 12:45 to 1:00 pm for a great afternoon of shooting. Last month it took our ten shooters about 2 1/2 to 3 hours to finish the course. Bring water and skeeter spray!!

Program 2. (CTO sponsored teams)

“That CTO, using donated funds for establishing shooting programs. Use those funds to pay for the cost of shells and nightly entrance fees for any Physically Challenged CTO member that is shooting on a team that has been endorsed by CTO and is using some form of Challenge The Outdoors as their primary name on team uniforms. This proposal only covers the cost of shells and nightly fees for Physically Challenged CTO members shooting in established league shooting. This proposal does not cover any league fees, uniforms, or any other funding as there are already programs in place to handle publicity. Non-Physically Challenged shooters are not eligible to receive these funds.”

Program 3. (Shooting for Fun at Bill Mayville's)

“That CTO, using donated funds for establishing shooting programs. Use those funds to pay for the cost of 100 Clay targets per month for any CTO member that would like to do practice shooting at Bill Mayville's property. Non-Disabled members will be responsible for providing their own ammunition. CTO will provide up to 4 boxes of shells per month for Physically Challenged members, but no more than 2 boxes per membership on any one outing. Physically Challenged shooters may bring a helper or guest shooter, but daily shell limits must be shared between shooter and guest. Shell limits can not be shared with others unless both parties are present. All shells issued by CTO must be consumed on the premise. No shells paid for by CTO can be taken off the premises. If a shooter stops shooting before reaching the daily limit of 50 rounds per outing, the shooter may return as often as they like until reaching the monthly 100 round limit. The fifty rounds per day, 100 round monthly limits only apply to CTO paid for Clay targets and shells. Shooters providing their own ammunition and clay targets can shoot as much as they want. No shooting is to take place unless shooters make prior arrangements with Bill Mayville.”

CTO Third Annual “Sight in your gun day” Wednesday: August 27, 2008

Nicolet Rifle Club Inc. has graciously offered Challenge The Outdoors Inc. exclusive use of the lower range for the sight-in. NRC volunteers will run the sight in portion of the shoot and staff the range. The sight in is free of charge to any disabled hunter that has a class A, B, or C, disabled hunting permit. Shooters are required to provide their own firearm, ammunition, hearing and eye protection. Hearing and eye protection are mandatory to use the range (none will be provided). This sight in will be for firearms only (no bows). Bring your rifle, pistol, muzzleloader, Turkey, or slug gun. You may bring more than one gun, but depending on how busy it is, you may be asked to rotate to the rear of the line after each weapon is sighted in (to give others a chance to sight in also). Please bring any adaptive equipment you use for hunting along to display and share ideas with the other hunters. CTO will have an information tent on adaptive equipment set up. Food and beverages are being discussed. A CTO committee has been formed to oversee the event. **The committee members are: Chairman Toby Malchow, Bob Mayer, and Bob Bird. Mary Jantz's Story—written by a friend

My husband and I just joined Challenge The Outdoors this year. Our friend took us out to Zander's Pond to introduce us to Larry and show us how easy we could move around the sides of the pond during fishing. Though it had just rained and was still overcast, we decided to start fishing.

I am 60-ish and have Cerebral Palsy and my husband has Cerebral Palsy and had Polio too. Wayne has taken John ice fishing and fishing in Canada, and he doesn't have too much trouble reeling in the fish. I have never been able to fish because I need assistance casting out and steadying the pole while reeling in a fish. Wayne showed me how to set the hook and helped me hold the pole while I reeled in the fish. This was the first time I had ever gone fishing in my whole life and this was my first fish that I ever caught. I never knew how exciting it could be.

Now my husband was having problems with his line and fishing pole so Wayne went to help him. Before he left me, Wayne threw my line in the water and started to go help John. Just like that I got another fish on my line so Wayne came back to help me. I was having a ball.

Too bad John had so much trouble with his fishing reel, because I ended up catching all the five fish by myself, with Wayne's help of course. Larry tried to help John but the fish liked my worms a lot. Wayne took John shopping the next day to buy a new fishing pole, reel, and new line. I guess John figured he better have a better pole so he can catch a couple of the fish before I catch them all.

I never knew how much fun this could be. I can't wait till we have our next fishing event. Thank you Challenge The Outdoors for this chance to get out and fish.

We arrived at 7:00 a.m. and set up our table at the Fox Valley Technical College during their Wheelchair Wash and Health Fair.

We displayed the two large picture boards on our table, along with our awards and trophies. We also put out information about Challenge The Outdoors, Inc. our different events, membership applications, newsletters, our new brochures, sign up sheets for those wanting to receive our newsletters and sign up sheets for those that would like to volunteer.

Bob and Rita Mayer, Cliff Pheifer, and myself talked to all those stopping by to look at our pictures and information. We answered any questions they had and explained our organization in more detail to them.

We had quite a few people asking questions, a few signed up for the newsletters and for volunteering. I think the event was very successful for Challenge The Outdoors and getting the information out to more people.

CHALLENGE THE OUTDOORS AWARDS PROGRAM

The 2nd Annual Awards will be given out at the 2008 summer banquet. Time frame is from July 1, 2007 to July 1, 2008. This year, the categories for fish have been expanded and all the award amounts have been reduced. In addition, each winner will receive a certificate of accomplishment. **A CTO member can only win one of the hunting/fishing/shooting categories in any one year.** Check the CTO Web, site for latest hunting and fishing categories and who has entered a category. <http://ctoforme.org/Awards.html>

Categories include:

Biggest Challenge Overcome Outside: One of our members this past year overcame his quadriplegia to hunt turkeys on his own. He set and reset his blind to get the best spot; he got in the blind and set up and after several exciting close calls was able to bag a turkey. Try and top that one to win. Award = \$75 gift certificate to Sportsman's Warehouse.

Deep-doo-doo Award: For the member who takes the biggest challenge in the outdoors. (Jeff Pagels not eligible for this award!) The first winner was a wheelchair user who dropped a goose in a muddy cornfield and after his able bodied buddy could not find the goose, he crawled through the mud to find it himself. While the mud got washed off in a hot shower, the glow of the satisfaction of his achievement will last lots longer. So, get out there and expand your limits. Award = \$75 gift certificate to Gander Mountain.

Volunteer of the Year Able bodied: For the CTO member who best embodies the spirit of giving to help others enjoy the outdoors. Award = \$100 gift certificate to Sportsman's Warehouse.

Volunteer of the Year Disabled: For the CTO member who best embodies the spirit of giving to help others enjoy the outdoors. Award = \$100 gift certificate to Gander Mountain.

Longest fish, by the following species: (length in inches) Photograph required. Award = \$25 gift certificate to Shields in Appleton for the longest fish in each category. Lake Michigan/Green Bay Trout or Salmon; Walleye; Musky/Northern; Perch; **Small and Large Mouth Bass; Bluegill/Crappie;** Rough Fish; (Carp, Dogfish, Sheepshead ect.) One winner for the longest rough fish of all of the rough fish species.

Longest fish, by the following species: (length in inches) at the annual Shawano Lake Fishery. No Photograph Required. Award = \$10 gift certificate to Sportsman's Warehouse for the longest fish in each category. Walleye; Musky/Northern; Perch; **Small and Large Mouth Bass; Bluegill/Crappie;** Rough Fish; (Carp, Dogfish, Sheepshead ect.) One winner for the longest rough fish of all of the rough fish species.

Longest Trout at Zander Pond: (length in inches) Photograph required or verified by a member of the Zander Family. **There will actually be three awards this year. One award at each of the two Trout-a-Rama events and one more for the longest trout the other days of the general open season.** Award = \$15 gift certificate from Dicks.

Top score for Disabled Shooter at the J&H Sporting Clays Fund Raiser: Bust the most clay pigeons and win. Award = 4 free rounds of Sporting Clays at J&H.

Biggest Whitetail Buck: Number of Points longer than one inch x inside spread in inches with photograph. In case of ties or near ties, antlers will be re-measured in more detail by a CTO impartial measurer. to Sportsman's Warehouse. Award = \$50 gift certificate

Biggest Tom Turkey: Length in inches of spurs and beards with photograph. Award = \$50 gift certificate from Dicks.

Now that's an incentive to get some of our physically challenged people out fishing this year!! To provide these opportunities we will need your help.** While a few volunteers have stepped forward to be captains and first mates we can still use more. If you enjoy boating and/or fishing this opportunity may be just what you've been looking for. By volunteering your time you will be providing a much needed service to our physically challenged members wanting to get out for a morning or afternoon fishing/sightseeing trip and get to make some new friends and catch some fish along the way. CTO members **John Kempen and Gary Thyes** have volunteered to give hands on instructions on how to operate our pontoon boat and will make time for those wanting and needing to learn how. They will teach operational skills and basic maintenance of our boat so all our volunteer captains and first mates will be knowledgeable and confident in operating our boat safely. We are also requiring that **all** members wanting to captain our boat have prior boating skills and knowledge of how to operate it properly. A boating operational checklist has been developed and should help keep potential problems to a minimum.

Field Grants Program Guidelines Challenge the Outdoors, Inc

At the September, 2007 BOD meeting, revisions were discussed and approved for the CTO Field Grant Program. The program is designed to aid physically challenged members of Challenge the Outdoors, Inc to experience once-in-a-lifetime outdoor recreational events that they can not otherwise afford to attend. To be eligible to apply and receive funding under the Field Grant Program, an individual must be a disabled member of Challenge the Outdoors, Inc for at least one calendar year.

These grants (a maximum of \$200.00) are not available to non-disabled members of CTO.

A Field Grant will not be awarded to an individual for participation in another organization's event if CTO already conducts a similar event. The Field Grant Committee and Board of Directors can consider an exception under special circumstances. Persons that have received funds under the CTO Field Grant Program are not be eligible for another Field Grant to participate in the same type of event in the future. For example: A disabled member of Challenge the Outdoors is awarded a Field Grant to hunt Pronghorn in Wyoming. This member may not apply for another Field Grant to hunt pronghorn in the future.

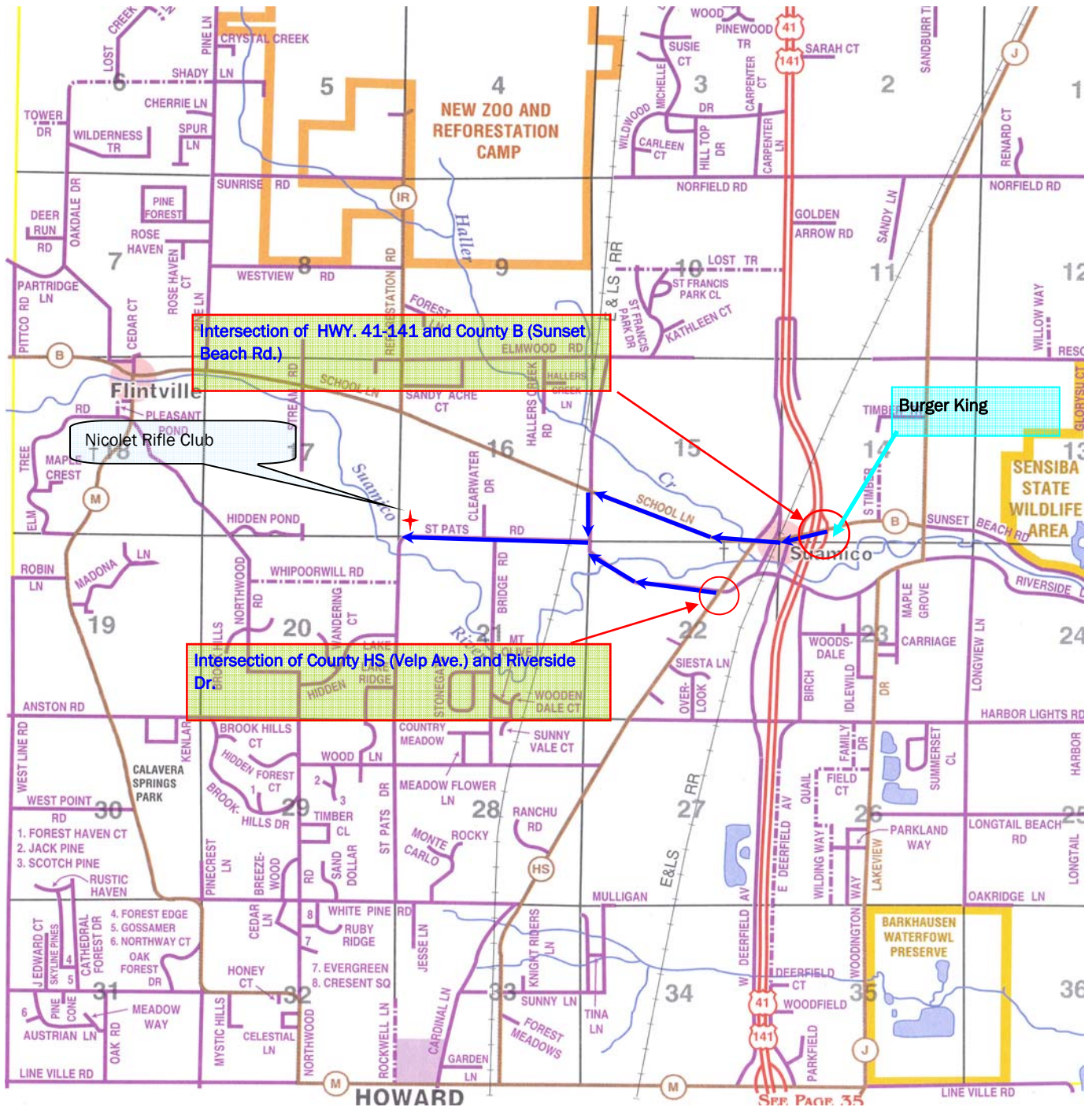

Cost Sharing Program for Adaptive Equipment Catching on

We know adaptive equipment can be a bit pricey so our hope, by creating this cost sharing program in December of 2004, was to help our physically challenged members offset that cost and encourage them to purchase their own equipment. Thus creating more independence for them. So far CTO has helped several members purchase adaptive hunting equipment including crossbows and hand cranks, and an adapted gunstock. We are still waiting for the 1st adaptive fishing equipment request. For those unfamiliar with our cost sharing program here's how it works. **CTO will help our physically challenged members purchase adaptive hunting or fishing equipment by picking up to ½, but not to exceed \$100.00, for the cost of the piece(s) of equipment 1 time per year.** For example say Jane purchases a crank for her crossbow and it cost \$150.00. CTO would reimburse Jane \$75.00. To receive reimbursement for a piece of adaptive equipment you have purchased or to see if a piece of equipment you're considering purchasing qualifies [contact Jean or Harland Chapman. \(920\) 525-1123](mailto:jean@netzero.com). ***Note, keep your receipt and get a duplicate copy of the original because we will need a copy for our records.
