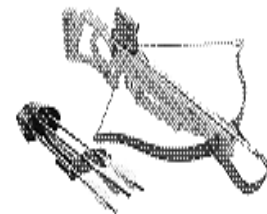
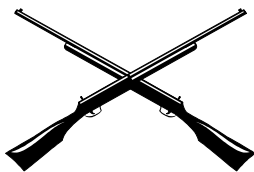


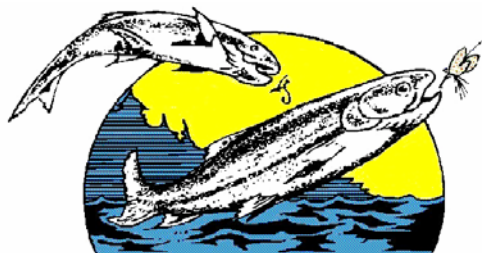

Words of Wisdom Larry Laehn, Past President

Allow me to share with you portions of an essay written by my daughter (a 19 year old freshman in college) regarding volunteer activity. If anyone ever doubts why the effort, as a parent or as a human being, of helping others is important, Angela's attitude quickly removes such doubt.

"They informed me that I was secretly selected by my high school (one Senior from each Appleton high school) to interview for the \$8,000 scholarship. Yet why would anyone choose me? I did not consider myself an extraordinary person and I told them (the scholarship interviewers) so."

"I was asked to give one word that summarizes how I want people to recall me. I pondered the question for a bit, and then quietly said "selfless". I will never forget the look on all three of their faces. They seemed shocked, yet pleasantly surprised. They asked me why people would remember me as an unselfish person. I said that perhaps it is because I spend a lot of my time as a volunteer helping others, more specifically the physically handicapped."

"I am ten years old, yet protective of my mother, who suffers from Dystonia. The clerk overcharged my mother for the groceries and she tried (with incoherent speech) to point it out to him. He did not understand her, but instead of being patient, turned to me and asked if she was "retarded or just plain stupid". I told the clerk, at least ten years older than me, that he rude and inconsiderate."

"Two years later, I was dressed head to toe in blaze orange and carrying a hunting rifle for a man in a wheelchair. My Dad, who suffers from MD, is a member of an outdoor club that is dedicated to the handicapped sportsperson. I was there to help. The experiences I have had on these hunting and fishing trips are burned into my memory. I have trudged through swamps to scare deer towards the hunters in their specially-equipped stands. I helped field dress a buck, a task that I never thought I would be able to accomplish or stomach! Yet I would never complain."

"I hear the laughter of Mike, a CTO member who suffers from MS, when I state in a matter of fact way how disgusting worms as I put bait on his hook. I see the joy in Harland's face, a man nearly blind, as he describes how cute the miniature donkeys are that he raises at his home."

"I suppose it may have been my parents, perhaps I felt obligated towards them guilt is not my true motivation. It is love for them, others and God that drives me. I want to serve the physically challenged, for in that way I can serve God."

I am proud to say that Angela got the scholarship. More important than the visible financial reward, she gets the value helping others in need adds to her life. That's a positive message to all of us!

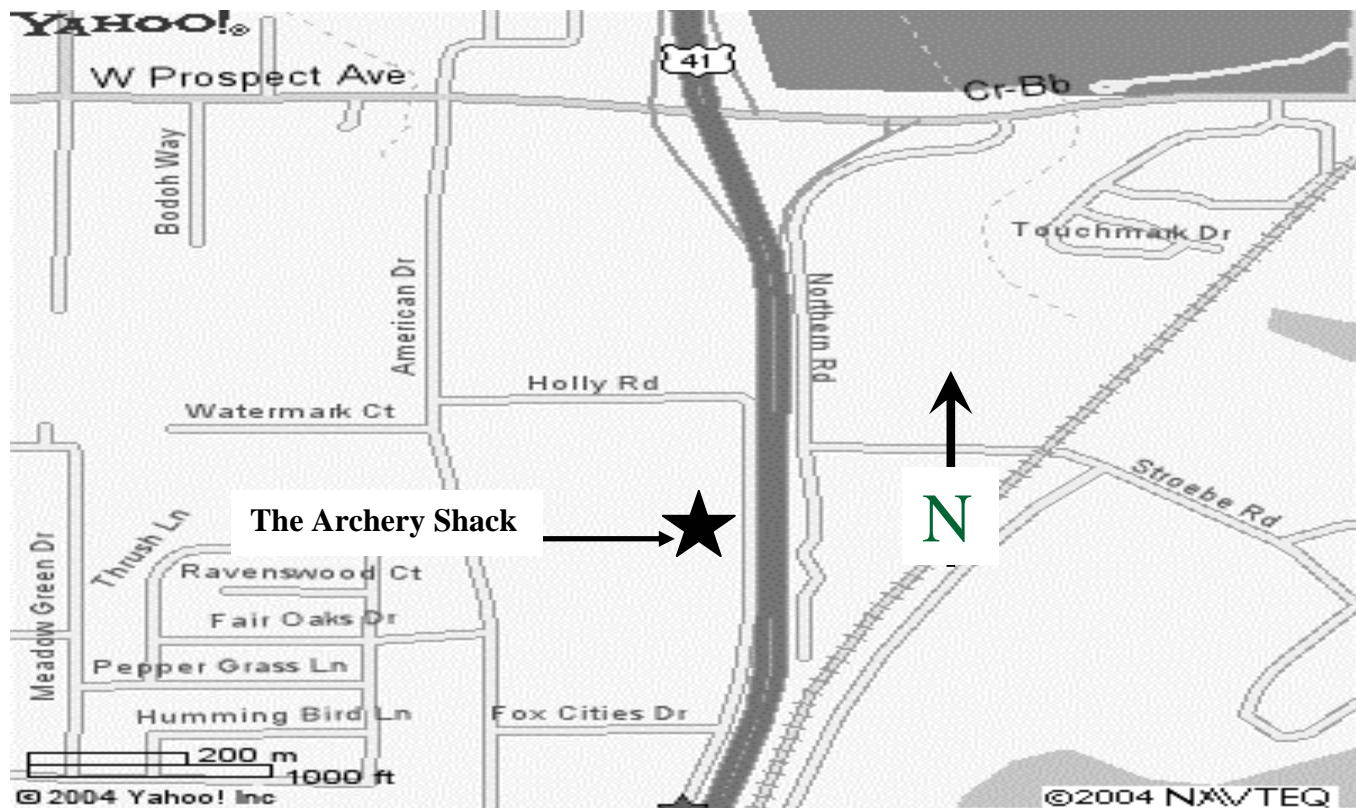

3-D ARCHERY SHOOT APRIL 16TH

MAY 14th & 15th WILD TURKEY HUNT

This year marks the 3rd Annual Little Wolf Gobblers & CTO Wild Turkey Hunt. This years hunt is stating to taking shape. We're planning for 15 hunters this year, that's 7 more than last year, with a few 1st time hunters that are in for an experience they'll never forget. Getting all the hunters into the fields and woodlands before the crack of dawn will take a substantial and coordinated effort on behalf of all the mentors/guides, volunteers, and hunters. We'll be working together to make sure the blinds are set up ahead of time and are accessible for all hunters as well as making sure the hunters have the needed adaptive equipment to ensure they are confident and able to put the lead/arrow where it counts if and when the gobbler comes into range. We have reserved the Christus Memorial Church Camp for lodging and will be preparing & serving food there as well. The camp is located between Clintonville and Marion just north of Hwy 45. It sits on 60 wooded acres, has outdoor camping areas, new bathrooms, showers, furnace, hot water, fully outfitted large kitchen, large assembly room with fireplace, 2 bunkrooms, and is wheelchair accessible. We will be working with the camp managers to make sure the needs of the hunters are met. Hunters, volunteers and mentors will be able to check in on Friday and stay through Sunday. We are having a pre-hunt get together on May 1st in the early afternoon where we'll be doing some target practicing, making preparations for the hunt, and getting to know one another.
