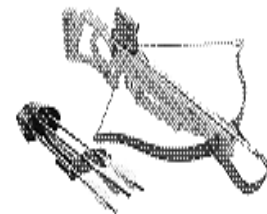
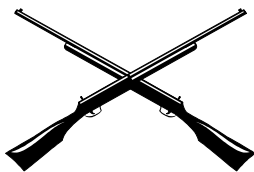


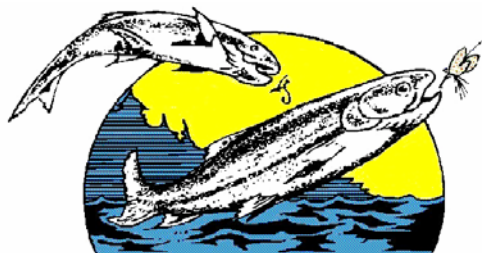

## 7th Annual CTO Shawano Lake Fishery & Picnic June 4th

On Saturday June 4th, 2005, CTO will be sponsoring it's 7th annual Shawano Lake Fishery and Picnic at Cecil's Lake Park. The park has been reserved and this will mark our 5th year of holding our fishery and picnic there. Cecil and Lake Park are located on the east end of Shawano Lake. The Park's located on the shoreline of Shawano Lake and has public parking areas in the boat launch parking lot and along a frontage road. ***For a map and directions see page 6.*** The Park's grounds are grass covered, fairly level and provide fairly easy and smooth wheeling for those who will be attending in wheelchairs. The park has a fish cleaning station, which we fully intend on putting to use, accessible rest-rooms, and a small beach with a swimming area. Just this past year a second dock was added that really makes loading and unloading much easier.

The Fishery and Picnic will take place **RAIN or SHINE** so please watch and or listen to the weather and come dressed and prepared for the weather that day. We will be putting up a large event style tent to provide all our participants with (hopefully) only needed shade. ***Go to page 5 for the complete Fishery & Picnic schedule.***

Thanks to the generosity of the pontoon boat & fishing boat owners that volunteered the use of their boats for our fishery last year we had plenty of room on the boats to accommodate all those that attended. Last year we had over 70 people attend of which 17 were physically challenged. At this time we have 8 pontoon boats lined up and should have a couple regular fishing boats as well. If you would like to bring your own boat for your own use or could volunteer the use of your boat for others for either half or the whole day we encourage you to do so. Please contact Harland Chapman or Mark Baehr if you are able to volunteer the use of your boat or are bringing a boat for your own use. Both pontoon boats and regular fishing boats are welcome and may be needed.

With our main goal being to get all the Physically Challenged anglers out fishing it may be necessary that we limit the number of guests that are allowed to accompany them on the boats. Physically Challenged anglers and their helpers will be given 1st preference for available spaces on boats, any spaces available after challenged anglers and their helpers have boarded will be made available to guests. We hope you understand and encourage you to schedule a family and friends fishing or sightseeing outing during the regular boating season. ***Please see page 7 for details on setting up an outing on CTO's pontoon boat.***

**The deadline for registering for the Fishery & Picnic is May 28th, please fill out the form completely and return it ASAP!!** Make note of how many guests will be attending with you. We ask that everyone planning on attending fill out the registration form. By doing this you will allow us to make sure we have enough boats, food, bait, and equipment on hand to make for an enjoyable and successful event. Even if you don't plan on fishing please come anyway and enjoy the camaraderie and great picnic at noon.

With the continued growth of this event so too has our need for volunteers. There are several areas where volunteers are needed. ## DIRECTIONS AND MAP TO CTO'S, INC. 7th ANNUAL SHAWANO LAKE FISHERY/PICNIC

To get to the Park / CTOs, Inc. Fishery Headquarters on Shawano Lake, in Cecil:

From the Fox Valley: Take Hwy 47 North to Bonduel. (approximately 35 miles from Appleton)

From Bonduel take Hwy 117 North to Hwy 22. (approximately 5 miles)

At the intersection of Hwy 117 & 22 Turn Right (east) on to Hwy 22.

Take Hwy 22 (approximately 1/3 of a mile) to the public boat launch just north of Park Street. Look for signs and our banner. You may park along the road or in the park/boat launch parking lot.

Our tent will be set-up to the left of the boat launch in the Park.

If you are coming from the Green Bay area take Hwy 29 West to the Hwy 117/47 exit to Bonduel. Follow directions above from Bonduel to the Park. Our pontoon boat is out of storage and has been tuned up and readied for another season of service. For this boating season CTO has again rented a slip at Cecil, on Shawano Lake. Our slip rental runs from May till October, so there will be plenty of time for getting out on the lake for fishing and or sightseeing opportunities.

A boating operational check list is being developed to inform all boat users the proper mode of operations and should help keep potential problems to a minimum.

During the March 2005 Board of Directors meeting Vice President Dean Sprangers brought up the idea of having CTO help Physically Challenged members with the purchase of adaptive hunting equipment. After some discussion it was decided that we would help the physically challenged members by picking up to ½ but not to exceed \$100.00 for the cost of both adaptive hunting and fishing equipment. For example say John purchases a crossbow cocker and his cost was \$150.00. CTO will reimburse John \$75.00. We really hope, by creating this cost sharing arrangement, our physically challenged members and their families are encouraged to purchase equipment that they will own and thus create more independence for them. To receive reimbursement for you a piece of adaptive equipment you have purchased contact Jean or Harland Chapman. **\*Note, keep your receipt or better yet get a copy of the original because we will need a copy for our records. And if you return the item please reimburse CTO. Thank you.** If you are looking for sources of adaptive equipment there are hundreds to choose from so shop around and check our website out for links to sellers and suppliers of adaptive equipment and as always please show patronage to the many great businesses that have been so good to us over the years by giving them your and our business. **CTO LOAN CLOSET IS ALWAYS OPEN!!** Our loan closet, or better said closets, are always open for our physically challenged and non-physically challenged members to check equipment out of. We currently have the following pieces of gear available: 9 camouflaged collapsible hunting blinds, 1 crossbow with case, quiver and arrows, 2 electric fishing rod & reel combos, several small tackle boxes with terminal fishing tackle, i.e. hooks, sinkers, bobbers, etc., 3 shooting chairs, & 4 Ice fishing shelters. Those are the major items and to loan them out contact either Bill Mayville at (715) 758-8363, Larry Zander at: (920) 525-5637, or Mark Baehr at (920) 766-9218. Be patient because our stuff is spread out just a bit but they'll track it down for you.
