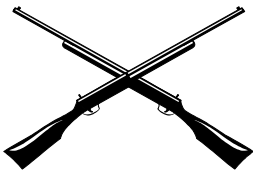


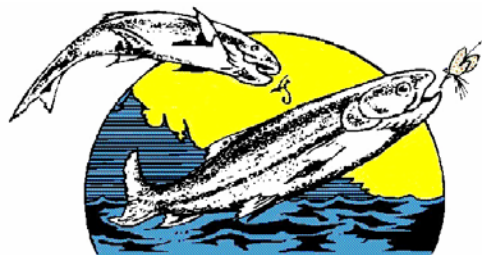

9th Bi Annual Trout O Rama — June 16, 2007

What a fun day this has been for all those who attend. Great food, wonderful camaraderie, and fat and sassy rainbow trout. Because the Trout O Rama has always been a great outing: those who have participated in the past come back again and again. I encourage you to bring your own lawn chairs if you have them. Also bring a cooler for your iced trout to stay fresh. We always have a couple of folks who will clean your fish and have them table ready. You are encouraged to bring a dish to pass and, as always, remember: personally I like to see sweet, sticky, gooey stuff. (I do scrounge for leftovers.) The main dishes are provided by CTO with Associate Director Karen Baehr always at the helm with her helpers setting banquets fit for royalty. (Which We Are!)

The CTO pond was re-stocked the third week of March with rainbow trout, some of which are already decent size. I should be able to add a couple more inches to them by the time of the outing. Fishing rules are simple: **#1** No catch and release **#2** Physically challenged fishers are allowed 5 trout per day and 10 trout per month. Break it up any way you want, i.e. day one—3 trout, day two—4 trout, day three—3 trout. **#3** Register your catch in the book at the pond. **#4** Non physically challenged fishers (CTO members) are allowed 3 trout per day with a total of 6 per month. **#5** If you are fishing with a partner limits stay the same per membership i.e. members: share your limit.

The CTO trout pond is open every day after June 16th until freeze-up. **NO LICENSE REQUIRED!** You and your friends are welcome to build a fire—have a picnic. Handicapped restroom is on site.

CHALLENGE THE OUTDOORS AWARDS PROGRAM

At the March CTO Board Meeting approval was given to spend up to \$1,500 annually for awards. Awards will be given out at the 2007 summer banquet. Time frame is from July 1, 2006 to July 1, 2007.

Award nominations are starting to come in, but more are needed especially in the volunteer, biggest challenges and deepdodo categories.

Categories include:

Biggest Challenge Overcome Outside: One of our members this year overcame a deep fear of water and started to fish on one of our fishing docks. Next step is to get in a boat. Try and top that one to win. **Award = \$150 gift certificate from Sportsman's Warehouse.**

Deepdodo Award: For the member who takes the biggest challenge in the outdoors. (Jeff Pagels not eligible for this award!) (One way to know if your experience might win is if it was not funny when it happened, but became funny a few days later when re-telling the story to friends!) **Award = \$150 gift certificate from Gander Mountain.**

Volunteer of the Year Able bodied: For the CTO member who best embodies the spirit of giving to help others enjoy the outdoors. **Award = \$300 gift certificate to Cabelas.**

Volunteer of the Year Disabled: For the CTO member who best embodies the spirit of giving to help others enjoy the outdoors. **Award = \$300 gift certificate to Cabelas.**

Longest fish, any species: (length in inches) Photograph required. **Award = \$100 gift certificate to Scheels in Appleton.**

Longest Trout at Zander Pond: (length in inches) Photograph required or verified by a member of the Zander Family. **Award = \$25 gift certificate from Fleet Farm.**

Top score for Disabled Shooter at the J&H Sporting Clays Fund Raiser: Bust the most clay pigeons and win. **Award = 8 free rounds of Sporting Clays at J&H.**

Biggest Whitetail Buck: Number of Points longer than one inch x inside spread in inches with photograph. **Award = Black Powder Muzzle Loading Rifle**

Biggest Tom Turkey: Length in inches of spurs and beards with photograph. **Award = Turkey hunting gear in the amount of about \$100 or \$150 if bird taken with a bow.**

Cost Sharing Program for Adaptive Equipment Catching on!

When we created our cost-sharing program, in Dec. of 2004, we weren't sure what kind of response we would get. A year and one-half later we're glad to report that we've had several members take advantage of the program purchasing crossbows, hand cranks, and an adaptive thumbhole gunstock. We are still waiting for our 1st adaptive fishing equipment request. For those unfamiliar with our cost sharing program here's how it works. **CTO will help our physically challenged members purchase adaptive hunting or fishing equipment by picking up to ½, but not to exceed \$100.00, for the cost of the piece(s) of equipment 1 time per year.** For example, say Jane purchases a crank for her crossbow and it cost \$150.00. CTO would reimburse Jane \$75.00. To receive reimbursement for a piece of adaptive equipment you are considering purchasing or to see if a piece of equipment you've purchased qualifies please contact Jean or Harland Chapman at: (920) 525-1123. ***Note, keep your receipt and get a duplicate copy of the original because we will need a copy for our records. And if you return the item please reimburse CTO.** There are many sellers of adaptive equipment so shop around and check our website out for links to sellers and suppliers and as always **please show patronage to the many businesses that have been so good to us over the years by giving them your and our business.** For a list of these businesses contact Larry Zander at: (920) 525-5637. **Thank you.**

This sight in will be for firearms only (no bows). Bring your rifle, pistol, muzzleloader, Turkey, or slug gun. You may bring more than one gun, but depending on how busy it is, you may be asked to rotate to the rear of the line after each weapon is sighted in (to give others a chance to sight in also). Please bring any adaptive equipment you use for hunting along to display and share ideas with the other hunters. CTO will have an information tent on adaptive equipment set up. In February and March of 2006, Shadows On The Wolf installed, with the help of some Local contractors who donated their time and materials, two handicap accessible fishing Docks at Koepke Park, north of Shiocton. Approximately one week after completion Someone, with time on their hands, vandalized the area tearing a handicap sign off one of The docks. I personally put up handicap signs, with the help of another volunteer, on each Dock and two in the parking lot. The sign on the dock was virtually beat off with a heavy Object (hammer/rock) because all that remained was the four corners of the sign. One Sign in the parking lot was broke off at ground level. But guess what it doesn't stop here. Just last week four volunteers purchased and installed a cable to each dock because the rising water with the ice not yet out could severely damage the docks. These cables lasted Two days. I just cannot believe there are people out there like that! If someone needs Some 7/16 cables, call me I will personally give the money to go and buy whatever you Need. But don't vandalize something that is there for public use. If any of you slime balls That have so much time on your hands want to do something that would help your local Community, contact me because we have numerous projects throughout the year that can Use volunteers. You can construct rather than destruct. The next time you see a person Confined to a wheelchair think about what you did. I hope you feel real proud of yourself. If this vandalism is meant for Shadows On The Wolf that is one thing, but hopefully not Against the handicapped. Shadows On The Wolf is offering a \$500.00 reward for the Name(s) and conviction of the individual(s) responsible. I live only a couple of miles from Koepke's Park. I drive by an average of four-five times a week; I would just love to Catch someone in the act of vandalizing this project!
