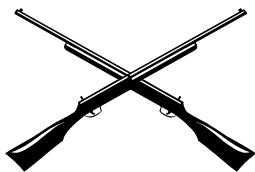


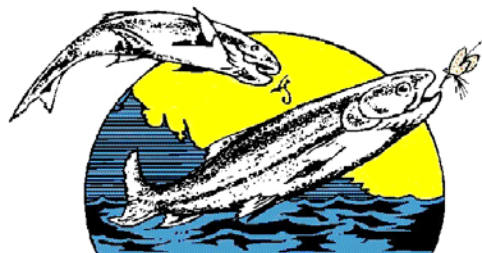

We continue to make progress with this year's Special Deer Hunt. The dead-line for contacting Patrick Nieuwenhuis (920-687-8707) to take part in the hunt is Friday, August 29, 2009—**No Exceptions Please!!** Pat will then get everything turned in to the DNR by their dead-line of September 2, 2009.

Once again this year, the hunt will be head-quartered at the Lessor Town Hall. To reach the Town Hall from the South, take Highway 47 North out of Black Creek for about 13 miles to Landstad Road and turn right or to the East. If coming from the North, take Highway 47 out of Bonduel and head South about 5 miles to Landstad Road and turn left, The Town Hall is less than a quarter mile and will be on the right side of the road. We will be having a pre-hunt meeting similar to the one we had last year. The meeting will be on Saturday morning, October 3rd at 10:00 a.m. We will probably be having lunch during the meeting like we did last year, too. This should leave us plenty of time to visit, renew old friendships, make new ones and still get to the woods for the afternoon hunt.

We will try to have the hunting blinds at least a week or two before the start of the hunt. 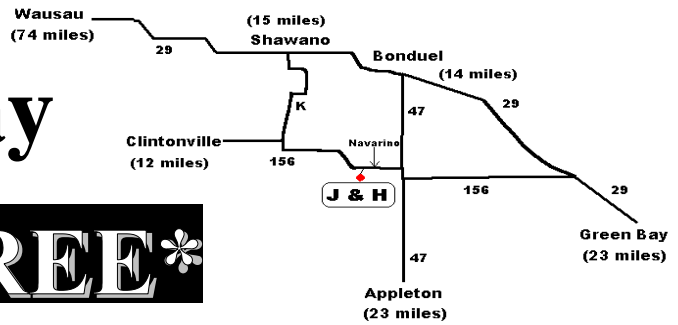

## **Boating & Fishing Season is Still Here!!**

Our Pontoon boat is getting a fair amount of use so far this summer and with almost 2 months left until we take it out of the slip on Shawano Lake there are plenty of days for our members to get out for a trip or 2. Pan fish are still the primary targets but there are better than average bass and pike fishing opportunities on Shawano Lake as well. As we noted in previous newsletters we've made some needed up-grades to the pontoon such as; replacing the old fish locator, putting vinyl graphics on each side advertising CTO, purchasing new life preservers & a detailed lake map, fixing the horn and replacing the old gauges and flare kit. We have also up-dated the instruction/rules of operation sheet and have copies on the boat and will provide anyone who wants or needs a copy with one.

**CTO will again be picking up the cost of gas for our members who use the boat as long as at least 1 physically challenged member is included in the party on board and within reasonable usage. Now that's an incentive to get some of our physically challenged people out fishing this year!! To provide these opportunities we will need your help.** If you enjoy boating and or fishing this opportunity may be just what you've been looking for. By volunteering your time you will be providing a much needed service to our physically challenged members wanting to get out for a morning or afternoon fishing/sightseeing trip and get to make some new friends and catch some fish along the way. CTO member John Kempen has volunteered to give hands on instructions on how to operate our pontoon. John will teach operational skills and basic maintenance of our boat so all our volunteer captains and first mates will be knowledgeable and confident in operating our boat safely. **We are requiring that all members wanting to captain our boat have prior boating skills and knowledge of how to operate our pontoon boat properly. The boating committee has still not decided on when and where the boat will be moved to before or after our slip rental ends at the end of September. All 13 boats stayed out for about five hours and then headed into shore. After unloading and getting the fish into the coolers, Two Rivers headed to M & M Lunch restaurant and Kewaunee and Algoma headed to Caffe' Tlazo in Algoma for a delicious breakfast. We took a few pictures at the restaurant, and then headed back to the Marina to take pictures of the fish, clean the fish, and ready for the transport home.

We agreed before we headed out to fish that we would all share in the catch. This way everyone at least received some fish to take home and enjoy a couple of great meals.

## Field Grants Program Guidelines Challenge the Outdoors, Inc

At the September, 2007 BOD meeting, revisions were discussed and approved for the CTO Field Grant Program. The program is designed to aid physically challenged members of Challenge the Outdoors, Inc to experience once-in-a-lifetime outdoor recreational events that they can not otherwise afford to attend. To be eligible to apply and receive funding under the Field Grant Program, an individual must be a disabled member of Challenge the Outdoors, Inc for at least one calendar year.

These grants (a maximum of \$200.00) are not available to non-disabled members of CTO.

A Field Grant will not be awarded to an individual for participation in another organization's event if CTO already conducts a similar event. The Field Grant Committee and Board of Directors can consider an exception under special circumstances. Persons that have received funds under the CTO Field Grant Program are not be eligible for another Field Grant to participate in the same type of event in the future. For example: A disabled member of Challenge the Outdoors is awarded a Field Grant to hunt Pronghorn in Wyoming. This member may not apply for another Field Grant to hunt pronghorn in the future.

### Cost Sharing Program for Adaptive Equipment Catching on

We know adaptive equipment can be a bit pricey so our hope, by creating this cost sharing program in December of 2004, was to help our physically challenged members offset that cost and encourage them to purchase their own equipment. Thus creating more independence for them. So far CTO has helped several members purchase adaptive hunting equipment including crossbows and hand cranks, and an adapted gunstock. We are still waiting for the 1<sup>st</sup> adaptive fishing equipment request. For those unfamiliar with our cost sharing program here's how it works. **CTO will help our physically challenged members purchase adaptive hunting or fishing equipment by picking up to ½, but not to exceed \$100.00, for the cost of the piece(s) of equipment 1 time per year.** For example say Jane purchases a crank for her crossbow and it cost \$150.00.
